

November 9, 1995 ACPB Minutes

Present: Cederberg, Lembke, Robinson, Wicks

Minutes of the October 6 meeting were approved as read.

Roberta reported that the CEPC had endorsed the stolaf-student mailing list as it currently reads. ACPB recommends that the CEPC make this policy known to the faculty. ACPB will also recommend to Karen Nelson and the Human Subjects Committee to inservice the faculty on problems with student surveys in classes.

Roberta reviewed the proposed cuts for the 10% reduction in budget. The \$20,000 remaining from last year has already been removed from the budget.

The ACPB approved the off-campus internet access policy. This will be published in the ACC Newsletter, the Campus Memo, and on the internet by Gary.

The Northfield Freenet request was denied.

Roberta provided an update on the systems manager position. There have been two searches to date. This first did not produce a qualified candidate, and the second found our salary range to be too low. Currently ACC is advertising in California. ACPB may send a letter to the Dean if this search fails and point out our low salary range and the impact it is having on the ACC.

Roberta gave a brief report on the EDUCOM conference she attended last week. The focus was on technology in higher education.

Continuing Education has requested a classroom to teach an evening computer course to be taught by our staff. ACC does not want to compromise the heavy use time by students. Recommended that Continuing Education consider Saturday mornings to teach this course. This course must be taught by ACC staff with St. Olaf software.

It was reported that two computers were stolen from public labs. It is suspected that these were stolen by students.

Dan Bergeson, manager of the Bookstore has initiated conversations with the ACC to move some of the retail Computer Store sales to the Bookstore. The ACPB needs to review the role of the Computer Store with the new student center before any recommendation can be made. Roberta reported the loss of all computer privileges by a student.

Two grant requests from Biology were reviewed and denied because of funding problems, and Biology has received funding in the past.
