

CEPC Minutes 3/2/00

CEPC members present: David Emery, Mary Griep, David Lesniaski, Amy Mangin, Margaret Hayford O'Leary, and Solveig Zempel.

Visitor: David Booth

1. Meeting was called to order by Chair - Zempel at 3:20.

2. Minutes of the 2/24/2000 meeting were approved. Minutes of 2/17/00 will be sent out by Griep this week.

3. Center of Integrative Studies:

David Booth presented a proposal for Linked Courses. Faculty are encouraged to adjust within present courses "to multiply opportunities for students to make meaningful connections among the many parts of their college careers." After discussion of the concept of linked courses and how to facilitate them, CEPC expressed enthusiasm for the proposal and its possibilities.

4. Asian Studies - course renumbering:

34-235 (Japanese: Modern Japanese Lit-TR) to 05-235 (Asian Studies: Modern Japanese Literature.)

11-236 (Chinese: Pop Trad in Chinese Lit-TR) to 05-236 (Asian Studies: Pop. Trad in Chinese Lit)

CEPC approved the changes.

5. Calendar:

Mangin reported that student response to the proposed calendar was positive.

O'Leary will more widely distribute the proposed calendar for feedback.

6. Change in the Dance Major:

Dance 260 - Articulate Body will no longer be a required core course for the major.

Dance 232 - Movement Analysis will become a required core course for the major.

CEPC approved the changes.

7. Other business:

Eric Cole requested a change of Interim Course Bio 249. The title of the course would change from "Investigative Protozoology" to "Investigative Microscopy" to reflect a broadening of the choice of organisms used. Both title and course description would change to reflect the wider emphasis of the course. CEPC approved the changes.

O'Leary asked whether courses waiting for approval by GEC should continue to be noted in the Class and Lab Schedule by a question mark.

CEPC agreed that the practice should continue as long as there was an expectation that the professor would notify students in the event the course was not approved for GEC credit.

7. Next meeting will be March 9, 2000. Dean Pence will attend to address CEPC questions.
