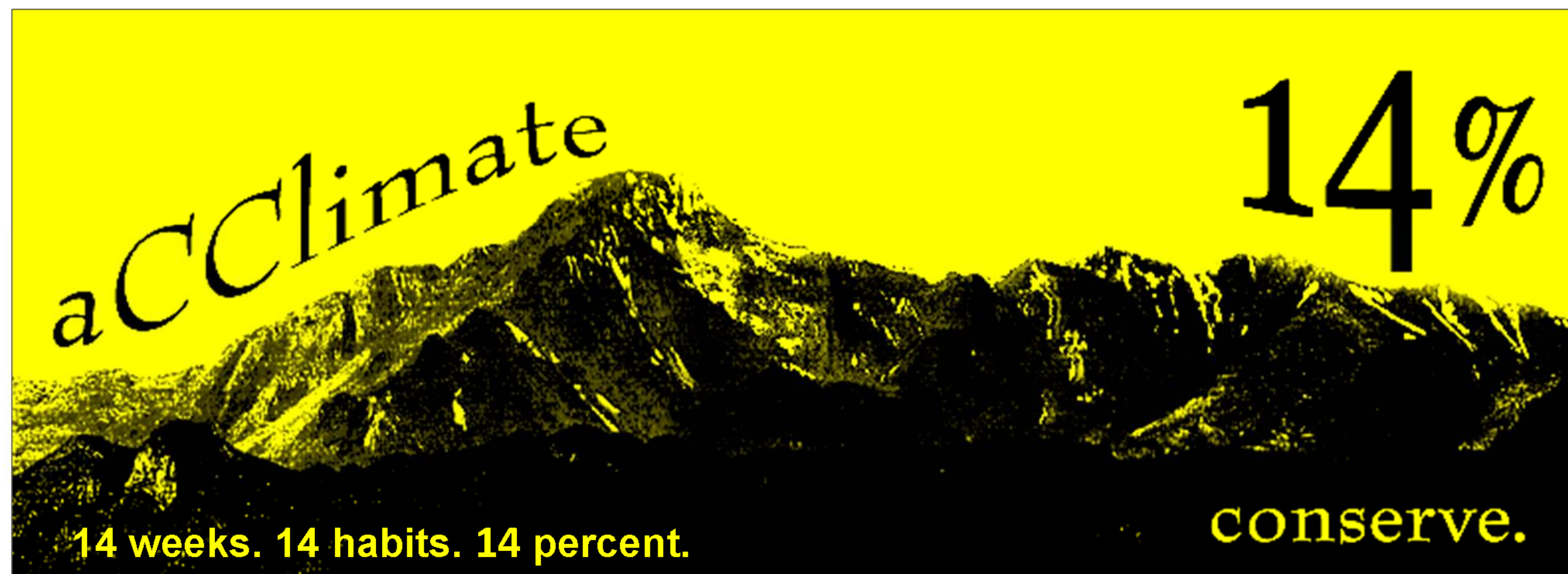
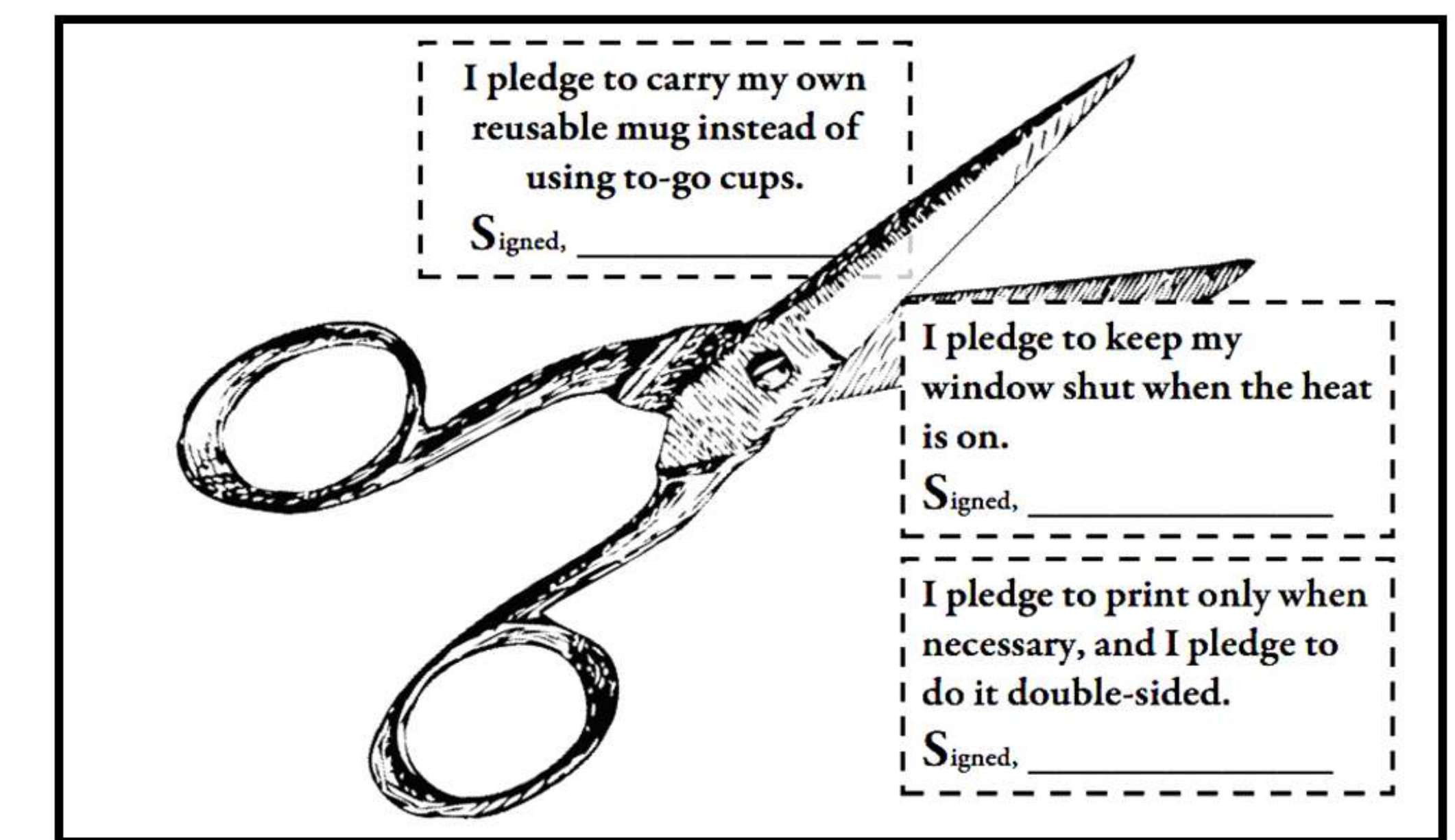


# Colorado College

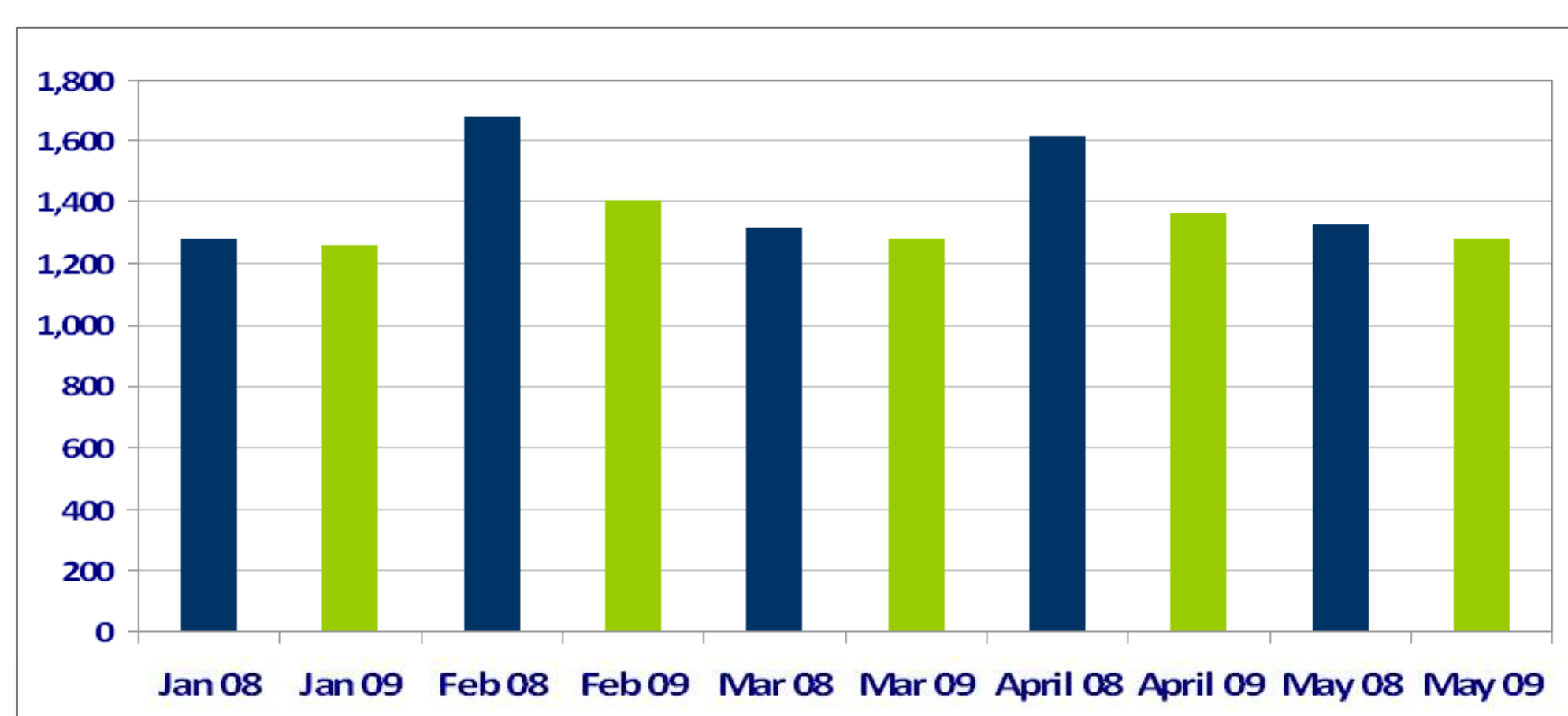

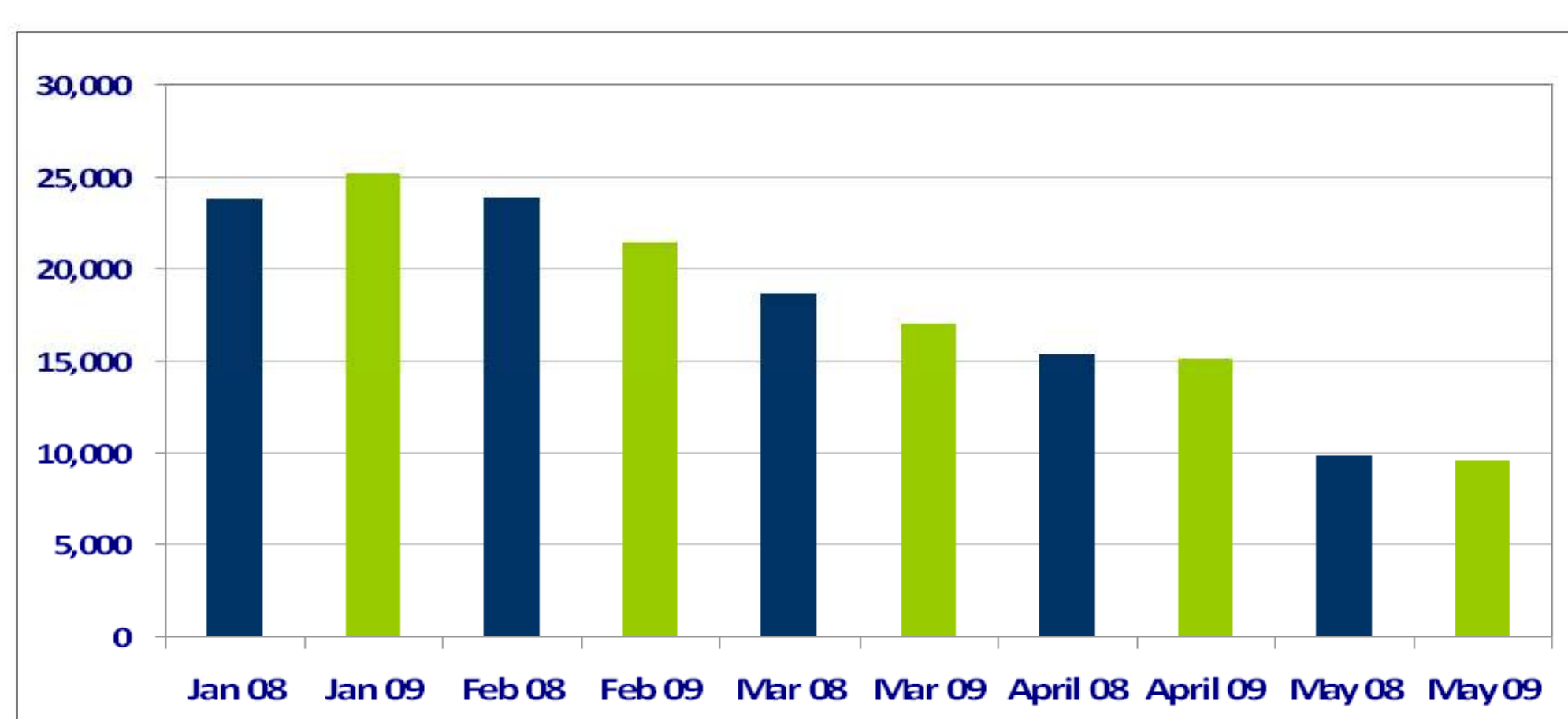
## WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Print and copy double-sided. Print only when necessary. Use PROWL or e-RES to read pdfs and other materials online.
- Enable sleep mode on your computer and monitor. Turn off your computer and other electronic devices when not in use.
- Switch off classroom, office, bathroom and dormitory lights when you exit the room.
- Unplug over breaks.
- Carry your own reusable cups, food containers and silverware.
- Reuse materials, recycle, & compost organic matter.
- Shut your window when the heat is on. Setback your thermostat and wear layers. Shut shades and blinds after dark.
- Reduce your travel. Carpool, combine trips, walk, bike, bus, or telecommute. Take the stairs.
- Wash laundry in cold or warm water. Use racks or clotheslines to air dry laundry.
- Take shorter showers. Turn off the tap while scrubbing dishes, washing hands & brushing teeth.

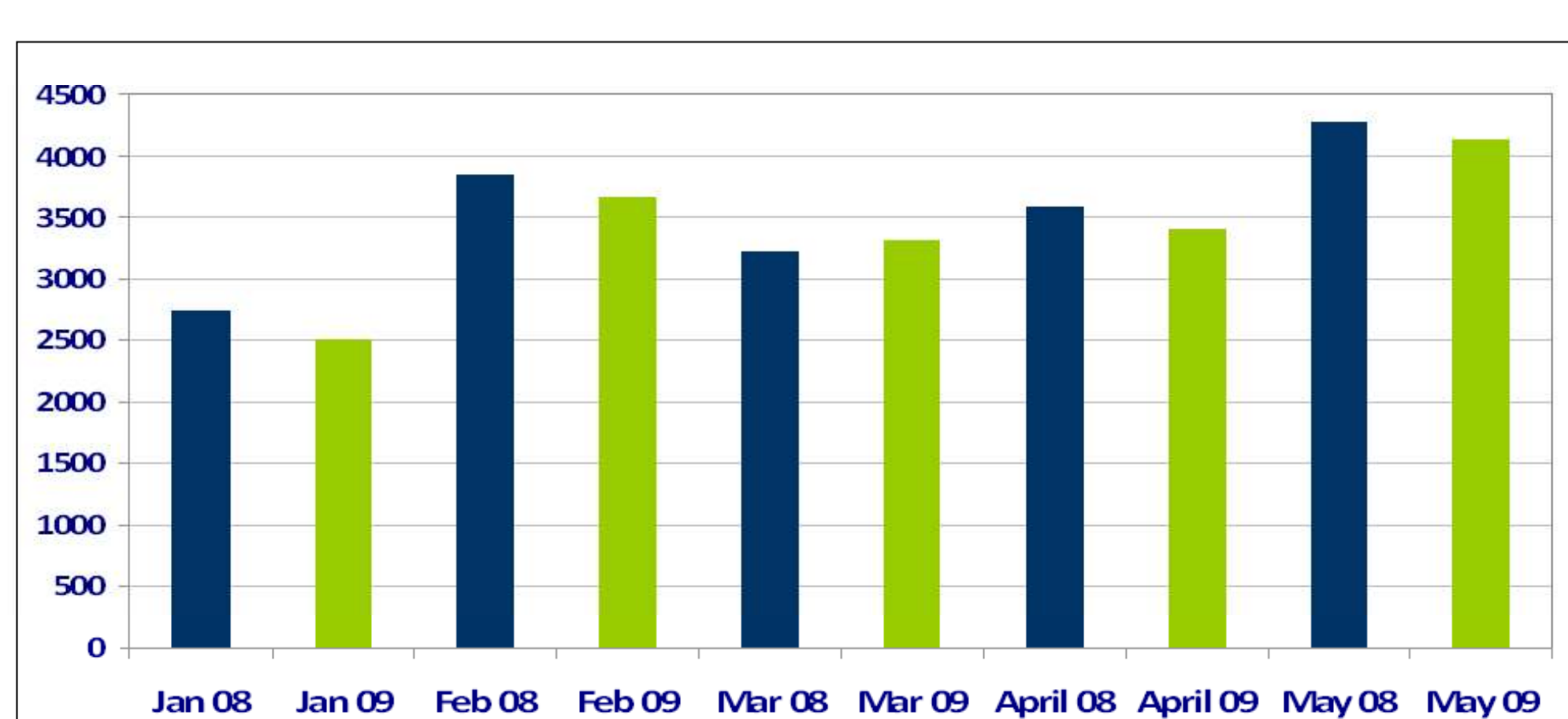

Colorado College estimates that during the course of the “aCClimate” campaign, the College saved \$100,000 in utility costs and cut greenhouse gas emissions by nearly 400 MTCO<sub>2</sub>e (compared to the previous year).

In addition, the College saw a 30% increase in the campus waste diversion rate, from 15 to 45 percent.
