- To provide you with a means of reflecting on your academic and experiential learning as it relates to your future

All work for your capstone project must be submitted by the deadlines listed on the back side of this document in your senior year.

Specific Requirements for completion of the Management Studies Capstone:

Due November 4th:

A. Experiential Learning Requirements Synopsis- to be submitted on Moodle

- Informational Interview #1 (Start by giving the person's name, title and organization.)
- Informational Interview #2 (Start by giving the person's name, title, and organization.)
- Required Internship or approved* significant work experience. *If not yet completed, describe an internship that you are seeking to fulfill this requirement.*
- Second experiential learning activity (second work experience, volunteer or leadership experience, etc.) *If not yet completed, describe an experiential learning activity that you are seeking to fulfill this requirement.*

B. Create a basic portfolio website: (Link loaded on Moodle- make sure it has been made public)

- Use your creativity and individuality to develop a website that reflects the following areas.
- *Homepage-* Include your vocational vision on this page. For some people, the term "vocation" is synonymous with career; for others, it refers to the multiple roles one plays at any given time in life and the interplay between those roles. In 1-2 paragraphs, write about your vocational vision, including the type of work you plan to do.
- *Coursework Tab/Link-* Choose a few of your courses to highlight. Provide the name of each course and a brief paragraph on how each course has helped you make progress toward your vocational vision.
- *Skills Tab/Link-* List 5 transferable skills you have developed that are related to your vocational vision. Consider the broad variety of transferable skills that they have developed through your liberal arts career.
- *Resume Tab/Link-* Upload a resume that has been reviewed by a Peer Advisor in the CEL.

Between November deadline & March deadline:

A. Complete a satisfactory practice interview in the CEL

B. Participate in the Career Network for Oles

Due March 30th:

A. Website demonstrating your skill set.

- The portfolio should contain materials that help you reflect on your knowledge and skills in preparation for an interview with a graduate/professional school, a non-profit/volunteer organization or a company.
- **Homepage-** Update your vocational vision by adding a paragraph regarding your plans for the first year (or two) after graduation. Include not only the *what* of your plan, but the *why* as well.
- **Skills Tab-** For each skill listed, link 2 artifacts which demonstrate that skill. Each artifact should be accompanied by a brief explanation of why you chose that artifact (How does it demonstrate that skill?). Your website should now include projects, papers, and other work products from both your academic endeavors and experiential learning activities (internships, jobs, extra-curricular involvements, etc.) that demonstrate specific content and transferable skills.

An assessment of the strengths and weaknesses of the portfolio will be requested on submission.
