

## Spanish Advanced Placement and Credit

Students entering St. Olaf with test scores of 5 (five) from the CEEB Advanced Placement Program are placed at the 250 level course. Students entering St. Olaf with test scores of 4 (four) from the CEEB Advanced Placement Program are placed at the 232 level course. The Registrar's Office will award credit for AP upon successful completion of the appropriate Spanish course (250, 232). Those students with a 5 (five) AP score who are placed in Spanish 250 are also eligible to take the Spanish Proficiency Exam if they wish to complete the foreign language requirement through examination. The passing of this exam – completion of the St. Olaf foreign language requirement – does not grant regular or additional course credits. Passing this exam means that the student has successfully completed the four semester-requirement in foreign languages (FOL) at St. Olaf.

### Students with test scores of 5 (five) from the CEEB Advanced Placement Program

The information below is about the impact of your Spanish AP results on placement and course credit. (If there is any discrepancy between your on-line placement result and your placement through AP, please follow the AP placement listed below).

Because your AP score is 5 (five), you have been placed in Spanish 250. Once you successfully complete Spanish 250, with a grade of "C" or higher, credit will be awarded for both Spanish 250 and AP Spanish Language and/or Literature (equivalent to Spanish 232). The Registrar's Office will award credit for AP upon successful completion of the Spanish 250 course. Because you have been placed at the 250 level, you are eligible to take the Spanish Proficiency Examination if you wish to complete the foreign language requirement through examination. If you take the Spanish Proficiency Examination and pass it, you will satisfy the St. Olaf foreign language requirement. You will not, however, receive regular or additional course credits for completing the foreign language requirement through the Proficiency Exam. Check your *Week One* booklet for information about registering for this exam, if you are interested. The exam itself is scheduled for Saturday, September 6<sup>th</sup>, at 9:00 a.m., Old Main 21 (Old Main, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor).

### Students with scores of 4 (four) from the CEEB Advanced Placement Program

Because your AP score is 4 (four), you have been placed in Spanish 232. Once you successfully complete Spanish 232, with a grade of "C" or higher, credit will be awarded for both Spanish 232 and AP Spanish Language and/or Literature (equivalent to Spanish 231).
