The Artists

Mark Frutkin has published eight novels, three collections of poetry, and three works of non fiction. His work has appeared in Canada (Knopf, Random House and others), the US (Soho Press), England (Carcanet Press), Russia, Poland, Holland, South Korea, Turkey and India. In 2007, his novel, Fabrizio's Return, won the Trillium Prize for Best Book in Ontario and the Sunburst Award, and was nominated for the Commonwealth Writers' Prize for Best Book (Canada/Caribbean region). In 1988, his novel, Atmospheres Apollinaire, was short-listed for the Governor General's Award for Fiction and was also short-listed for the Trillium Award, as well as the Ottawa/Carleton Book Award. As a journalist and critic he has written articles and reviews for The Globe & Mail, Harper's, the Ottawa Citizen, Montreal Gazette, Amazon.com/ca, Ottawa Magazine and other publications. His poetry and fiction have been published in numerous Canadian and foreign journals including Canadian Fiction Magazine, Descant, Prism International, New Letters (USA), and others.

He has also worked as a speechwriter for a Member of Parliament, federal ministers and high tech executives, and was editor of ArtAction Magazine and co-editor of ARC Magazine, the poetry journal. He has taught creative writing at Carleton University, University of Ottawa, the University Of New Brunswick, University of Western Ontario and Naropa Institute in Halifax.

James McKeel, professor of music at St. Olaf College and director of its Lyric Theatre Season, has for 35 years advocated arts outreach in Minnesota through his composing, performing, directing, and teaching with Minnesota organizations such as Minnesota Opera, The Twin Cities Opera Guild, The Schubert Club, Young Audiences Inc., Minnesota Orchestra, American Composers Forum, Southern Theater, WAMSO, Minnesota Institute for Talented Youth, New Works Ensemble, Duluth Symphony, Midwest Opera Theater, St. Paul Landmark Center, Macalester College, Carleton College, St. John's University, and St. Olaf College.

As a composer of over 70 major work including operas, operettas, musicals, choral works, film scores (premiered in New York and France), arts songs, and song cycles Mr. McKeel has received commissions, grants, and premieres from the McKnight Foundation, SEMAC (Southeastern Minnesota Arts Council), The Kennedy Center, Minnesota Opera, Minnesota Composers Forum, The Jerome Foundation, The Blandin Foundation, The Margaret Jory-Fairbanks Foundation, Midwest Opera Theater, The Southern Theater, The Twin Cities Opera Guild, St. Olaf College, and Bel Canto Voices, among others.

His lyric theatre works include *The Mysteries*, a staged philosophical oratorio, *Love Sonnets of a Hoodlum*, a jazz-era mobster-in-love opera, *The Hero of Hamblett*, a medieval fantasy children's opera based on an award-winning-children's book, *Reveille to Requiem*, an opera concerning Minnesotans in the Civil War, and *Jargonauts*, *Ahoy!*, a children's fantasy opera about the power of words, which was commissioned by Minnesota Opera and the Jerome Foundation, toured for two years, was seen by over 20,000 students, and featured in a PBS special on reading.

His choral song cycle, *In Reference to a* Child, was commissioned by the Bel Canto Voices, featured in the Kennedy Center's "*Year of the Child*" concert, and toured throughout the South Pacific.

As a performer Mr. McKeel has sung over 70 roles with the opera companies of Santa Fe, Minnesota, St. Louis, Pittsburgh, Muny, and Baltimore as well as England's Aldeburgh Festival, Guthrie Theatre, Plymouth Music Series, Dale Warland Singers, Kennedy Center, American Composers' Forum, New Works Ensemble, Midwest Opera Theater, Duluth Symphony, and the Minnesota & St. Paul Chamber Orchestras. Leading roles range from *The Magic Flute & The Marriage of Figaro* to *La Boheme & Carmen* to premieres of *Casanova's Homecoming*, *The Juniper Tree*, and the award-winning *A Death in the Family*.

Other performances include *Lady in the Dark*, *Sweeney Todd*, and *The Threepenny Opera*, the critically-acclaimed premiere of *The Three Hermits*, the award-winning *Paul Bunyan* with England's Aldeburgh Festival and Plymouth Music Festival, and *As You Like It* at the Guthrie Theatre with Val Kilmer and Patti Lapone.
