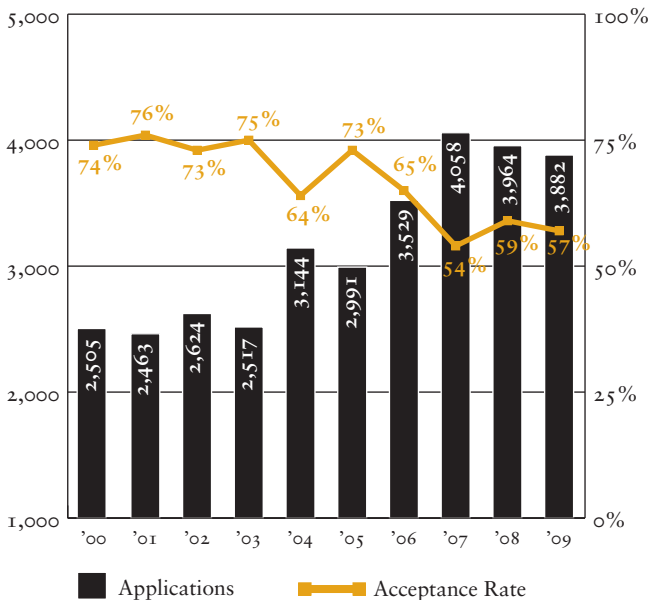


ENROLLMENT

Fall 2008 enrollment was 3,073 students, with 50 states and 30 other countries represented in the student body. As in previous years, 98 percent of those enrolled were degree-seeking students.

The applicant pool for fall 2009 remained strong, with 3,882 applicants for 777 first-year spots and an acceptance rate of 57 percent. There were 37 National Merit Scholars in the class, and a record 63 students were named Buntrock Scholars, the College's most prestigious academic merit scholarship.

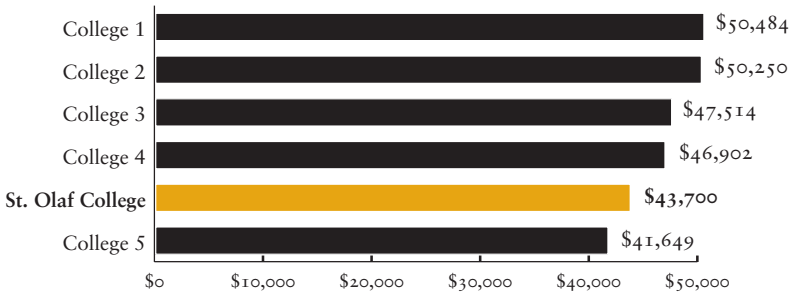
