Welcome to the Great Vigil of Easter. This service is one of the most ancient of all Christian observances. In it the great acts of God for all people are recounted, from creation to redemption.

- * The lessons recall God's covenant promises to his people; and we will renew our baptismal vows to God.
- * The ALLELUIA is restored.
- * The service concludes with the first communion of Easter.

The congregation gathers on the plaza outside. Each person is invited to take a candle which will be lit from the Paschal candle.



- Brothers and sisters in Christ...


 Now, therefore, I ask you to profess your faith in Jesus Christ, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize,






