E. Discussion on SOAP

- 1. Increases work opportunities, SGA can focus more on student government and organization.
- 2. How will the SOAP hiring process work? The previous coordinators will be included in the hiring process with administrative advisors. Incoming coordinators will have an executive team.
- **3. How will SOAP work with SGA elections?** The hiring process will not be as difficult as elections. The posting will be at the same time as SGA elections, similar to the PAUSE.
- **4. Can students move between different programming branches in SOAP?** Co-coordinators would be able to decide if students can move between after a semester or year.
- 5. Who made up this body? All of the programmers currently and other executive members. General membership of the people within these programming groups would be 30 people under the executives and co-coordinators.
- 6. Could you speak to the need for a new model and why this model is less difficult than the current one? The 4 separate groups would be together, rather than separately. Events would be planned far in advance and would increase communication between co-coordinators--allowing for a breadth of programming, rather than clusters.
- 7. What would Student involvement entail? 30 people or more? Would this SOAP model increase student involvement or would it lower the availability to handle these events? That number would fluctuate

according to the amount of people that would like to be able to participate with how many people coordinators would like. It's flexible.

V. Discussion - 30 minute time limit

A. Revisiting SOAP ~ Chair Mosher

1. Discussion Questions:

- a) What are the Pros and the Cons to consolidating all programming branches?
- **b)** How will it perpetuate the issues we're seeing in regards to the disconnect between students and SGA?
- c) Does the current hiring structure reflect the interests of the entire student body?
- **d)** What makes the SOAP model different from the programming structure we already have?

2. Group Discussion:

- a) Appointment of the positions appears undemocratic. Are co-coordinators necessary if the students are able to find a way to collaborate with liaisons between the current programming branches?
- **b)** SOAP would be complicated with voting, which is why hiring would work better for this model.
 - (1) People may not run due to being put into the spotlight, even though they may have experience and being qualified.
 - (2) Elections are beneficial, because people should feel as though they have a voice.
- c) Will SOAP be 100% student run? Are the paid positions only appointed or are they hired?

- **d)** What is the main point of the model? What is its primary goal and function?
 - (1) Students would be able to go to one space for getting involved.
 - (2) Good opportunity to rebrand SGA and programming committees.
 - (3) Promotes better and quicker programming, but doesn't solve the issues and separation between students and SGA/programming.
- e) Are we comfortable with co-coordinators being appointed with complete power over programming?

Meredith Enerson is working on "Senate Sundays" as an opportunity to promote transparency and education on the roles of senators and coordinators for future elections.
