BIOGRAPHIES



Jayce Ogren has established himself as one of the most innovative and versatile conductors of his generation. From symphonic concerts to revolutionary community service programs to operatic world premieres, Mr. Ogren is a leader in breaking down barriers between audiences and great music. Mr. Ogren began his career as Assistant Conductor of The Cleveland Orchestra and Music Director of the Cleveland Youth Orchestra, a concurrent appointment he held from 2006–2009. In the years since, he has conducted many of the world's most prominent orchestras,

including the BBC Symphony, Boston Symphony, Ensemble Intercontemporain, Hong Kong Philharmonic, Los Angeles Philharmonic, New York Philharmonic, the Dallas and San Francisco Symphonies, and the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, in programs ranging from Mozart to Beethoven through Sibelius and Bernstein, to presenting U.S. and world premieres of works by Steve Mackey and Nico Muhly. Among the numerous progressive projects Mr. Ogren has conducted are the New York premieres of Leonard Bernstein's only opera, A Quiet Place, and puppeteer Basil Twist's The Rite of Spring, both at Lincoln Center; the world premiere of David Lang's symphony for a broken orchestra, bringing together 400 student, amateur, and professional musicians in Philadelphia; and the world premiere of Jack Perla's Shalimar the Clown at Opera Theatre of St. Louis. A longtime collaborator of singer/songwriter/composer Rufus Wainwright, Mr. Ogren conducted the 2012 U.S. premiere of his opera *Prima Donna* at the Brooklyn Academy of Music, and led its recording with the BBC Symphony on Deutsche Grammaphon in 2016. Mr. Ogren and Mr. Wainwright have since appeared together throughout the world, with ensembles such as the National Arts Centre Orchestra in Ottawa, the Orchestre national d'Île-de-France in Paris, and the Toronto Symphony. A devoted educator, Mr. Ogren was invited by renowned poet Paul Muldoon to create an interdisciplinary studio class at Princeton University for the 2017-2018 academic year. He has worked with students at the Brevard Music Center, the Juilliard School, Manhattan School of Music, Music Academy of the West, and Verbier Festival. In 2016, he presented a unique workshop in orchestral rehearsal techniques for music teachers at Carnegie Hall in collaboration with the Carnegie Hall Weill Music Institute and the Juilliard School Pre-College. For his own part, Mr. Ogren earned his master's degree in conducting at the New England Conservatory and studied as a Fulbright Scholar with Jorma Panula. A native of Hoquiam, Washington, Jayce Ogren lives in Brooklyn, New York with his wife Carly, an architect, and their son, Alistair. An avid athlete, he has run the Big Sur, Boston and New York City marathons, the JFK 50 Miler trail run, and the Ironman Lake Placid triathlon. As an individual member of 1% for the Planet, Mr. Ogren is proud to connect his artistic work with his deep love of nature and concern for the environment.

Timothy Mahr holds a bachelor of music degree in composition and a bachelor of arts degree in music education from St. Olaf College, and a master's degree in trombone performance and doctorate of musical arts in instrumental conducting from the University of Iowa. An internationally-acclaimed composer, Dr. Mahr received the 1991 Ostwald Award in the ABA Band Composition Contest for his composition *The Soaring Hawk*. He was elected to the American Bandmasters Association in 1993. Dr. Mahr now has over 50 publications since the launch of the



Mahr Music Press, with many released on compact disc recordings and included on state contest lists. Formerly director of bands at the University of Minnesota-Duluth and founding conductor of the Twin

Ports Wind Ensemble, Dr. Mahr is the principal conductor of the Minnesota Symphonic Winds and is active as a clinician and guest conductor nationally and internationally. Notable commissions have come from the United States Air Force Band, the Music Educators National Conference, and the American Bandmasters Association. 25 of his works have been published, with many released on compact disc recordings and included on state contest lists. Dr. Mahr is a former president of the North Central Division of the College Band Directors National Association (1999–2001), has served on the Board of Directors of the National Band Association (1996–98), and was a founding board member of the Minnesota Band Directors Association. He was appointed composer-in-residence for the 2020 Music For All National Festival and Honor Band of America, and commissioned by a consortium of bands led by The Maryland Winds (Col. Timothy Holtan, conductor) to compose a work to premiere as this event.



Catharine Sinon Bushman received a doctorate of musical arts in wind conducting at The University of Texas at Austin in 2012. She holds degrees in music education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and Northwestern University. She maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinician for marching and concert bands. In 2009, she presented a clinic at the Texas Music Educators Conference, sharing her research on a successful band program in a disadvantaged southwest Texas community.

She has also presented on woodwind pedagogy, mentoring of women band conductors, and music by underrepresented composers at Minnesota Music Educators Association (2017) and the Midwest Clinic (2016, 2018, 2021). Dr. Bushman launched the first satellite camp of Athena Music and Leadership Camp in Minnesota in 2018. Her professional memberships include College Band Directors National Association, Women Band Directors International, Society for Music Teacher Education, and Minnesota Music Educators Association. She is a member of the Executive Council for the Institute for Composer Diversity and partner for the On the List Project and the wind band recording network, And We Were Heard. Dr. Bushman began her teaching career as Director of Bands at Crystal Lake Central High School in Crystal Lake, Illinois. She was the Associate Director of Bands at Lassiter High School in Marietta, Georgia from 1998-2007. The Lassiter Marching "Trojan" Band is a 280-member organization that has performed at the Tournament of Roses Parade, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, and has won numerous regional and national championships. She has served on the faculties of Winthrop University (South Carolina) and St. Cloud State University (Minnesota), where she is Associate Professor of Music Education and Instrumental Conducting and is on sabbatical for the 2021-22 school year.

Dr. Matthew McClung is an orchestral percussionist, chamber

musician, and soloist. He has performed with the symphony orchestras of Corpus Christi, Hong Kong, Honolulu, Houston, Minnesota, Phoenix, San Antonio and Victoria, among others. Most recently he has appeared as guest principal percussionist and timpanist with the Grammy-winning Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra. Matthew is currently an Adjunct Professor of Music at St. Olaf College, and the principal percussionist of the River Oaks Chamber Orchestra and Glimmerglass Opera Festival. Matthew proudly endorses Vic Firth sticks and mallets, and Zildjian cymbals.
