Welcome to this All Saints Sunday Concert Mass. On this day we remember with gratitude those who shaped our lives, encouraged us, forged our pathways. This includes the personal influences on each individual, and those who contributed to our larger communities. This program of *Many Voices* seeks to embrace the music that has long served to uplift us and to discover new voices from a wide range of sources. The works of Hovland and Dawson are well-known to our tradition, but Malcolm Boyle and David Hurd are well-known in Anglican circles but less frequently heard on campus. Of the two female composers, Jane Marshall's work has been widely recognized for it's beauty and craftsmanship, but this is the first time the music of Renaissance composer Rafaella Aleotti has been heard at St. Olaf. Today we truly join the praise of saints and angels at all times and in all places.






