Brian Carson, a native of Watertown, New York, attended The Oberlin Conservatory of Music, where he was a student of Garth Peacock and Haskell Thomson, and The Eastman School of Music, where he was a student of Russell Saunders. While at Eastman, he was the assistant organist to Bruce Neswick at Saint Paul's Episcopal Cathedral, Buffalo, NY. He won second place in the American Guild of Organists' National Young Artist Competition in Organ Playing. For 17 years, he was the choirmaster-organist of The Church of Saint Louis, King of France, in St. Paul, Minnesota, and is now the director of sacred music and principal organist at Nativity of Our Lord Catholic Church in St. Paul, where he also directs the Nativity Youth Choir. His choirs of boys and girls have toured England and Italy, singing at Westminster Abbey, York Minster, Lincoln Cathedral, St. Mark's Cathedral in Venice, and the Gèsu and St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.
