GUEST ARTISTS

Ralph M. Johnson '78 (he/him/his) is a choral conductor and composer based in the Twin Cities. Over a 43-year career, he has served as music director for a number of Twin Cities congregations, retiring this past summer after a wonderful II years at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd in Minneapolis (a congregation with many ties to St. Olaf). A former member of both the St. Olaf Choir and St. Olaf Chapel Choir (along with current Ole Choir conductor Anton Armstrong), Ralph has combined his work as a choral conductor with an active career as a composer, and has been honored to have heard his compositions sung by several of St. Olaf's choral ensembles over the years. Ralph holds the bachelor of music degree in music theory and composition from St. Olaf College, and the master of arts degree in music theory and composition from the University of Minnesota. As a church musician, he has delighted in working with singers of all ages, from three years old up to 93, and has enjoyed conducting choirs in smaller anthems as well as larger works by Heinrich Schütz, Maurice Duruflé, Gabriel Fauré, John Rutter, and others. Ralph is thrilled to have this opportunity to get to know and to make music with the extraordinary student musicians here at St. Olaf this spring.

A recipient of the prestigious McKnight Artist Fellowship for Musicians, Tracey Engleman has performed operatic roles with the Minnesota Opera, Minnesota Concert Opera, Skylark Opera, Arbeit Opera, Music by the Lake, and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. A particularly gifted performer of 20th-century and contemporary music, Ms. Engleman has performed chamber music with Zeitgeist, the Chicago Chamber Musicians, the Tanglewood Music Center and the Boston Symphony, and frequently premieres works by living composers. Her CD Lift me into Heaven Slowly featuring song cycles by Libby Larsen was released by Innova Records in 2017. Concert engagements include solo performances with the Minnesota Orchestra, the La Crosse Symphony Orchestra, Milwaukee Bel Canto Chorus, the Valley Chamber Chorale, Minnesota Choral Union, the Cannon Valley Orchestra, and the Rochester Choral Arts. As a proponent of art song and as a frequent recitalist, she has performed in recital at Orchestra Hall, Hope College, at the National Association of Teachers of Singing National Convention, Source Song Festival, and as part of the Schubert Club Courtroom Concert Series. An alumnus of the Tanglewood Music Center and the Art Song Festival of Cleveland, Ms. Engleman's awards include Regional Finalist in the Metropolitan Opera Competition, first place winner in the Austin Lyric Opera Young Artist Competition, Finalist in the Sun Valley Opera Competition, recipient of the Minnesota NATS Artist Award, and winner of the Milwaukee Bel Canto Chorus Regional Artist Competition. Equally passionate about teaching voice, Ms. Engleman is an associate professor of music at St. Olaf College where she teaches voice and vocal pedagogy.

KrisAnne Weiss, mezzo-soprano, has performed leading roles in many operas, including *L'Italiana in Algeri*, *The Dangerous Liaisons*, *Die Fledermaus*, *Le Nozze di Figaro*, *Così fan tutte*, *Madama Butterfly*, and *The Consul*. She has appeared with Skylark Opera, An Opera Theatre, Lyric Opera of the North, Pine Mountain Music Festival, Fargo Moorhead Opera, Opera Omaha, Central City Opera, Minnesota Opera, and Opera on the Lake. Her concert appearances include solos in Bach's *B minor Mass*, *St. John Passion*, and *St. Matthew Passion*; Mozart's *C minor Mass*, *Coronation Mass*, and *Requiem*; and Vivaldi's *Gloria* and *Magnificat*. She has performed with Zeitgeist, Valley Chamber Chorale, St. Catherine Choral Society, the Bakken Trio, Mississippi Valley Orchestra, Plymouth Symphony (MI), Bel Canto Chorus of Milwaukee, Duluth-Superior Symphony Orchestra, Exultate, the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra, and Nautilus Music-Theater, among others.

An advocate of contemporary music and art song, Dr. Weiss has premiered and workshopped countless new compositions, among them John Tartaglia's orchestral work *Dark Night*, *Glad Day*, the lead role in Chris Gable's opera *The Ladysmith Story*, and Edie Hill's dramatic concert work *Amy Lowell: A Rare Pattern*. Also an accomplished recitalist, chamber musician, and narrator, Dr. Weiss has given many solo recitals in the Twin Cities and can be heard in frequent collaborations with other local musicians. She is also the host of An Opera Theatre's Voice Labs, a free artistic development resource for local singers at any point in their careers.

Dr. Weiss completed her master of music and doctor of musical arts degrees at the University of Minnesota, where she received the University Fellowship, the Graduate Research Partnership Program Grant, and the Schuessler Graduate Prize in Voice. She has taught on the voice faculties of the University of Minnesota, Lawrence University, Luther College, Mount Olivet School of Music, and Lutheran Summer Music Festival and Academy. She teaches private lessons in St. Paul, and is on the voice faculty at Carleton College and St. Olaf College.

Praised for his "clean, clear voice," **David Walton** has made numerous appearances across the country in leading operatic roles and concert performances. Recent highlights include Frederic in *The Pirates of Penzance* with Cincinnati Opera and Ferrando in *Così fan tutte* with Opera Delaware. Other roles include Almaviva in *Il barbiere di Siviglia* at the Glimmerglass Festival with Francesca Zambello, Belmonte in Mozart's *Die Entführung aus dem Serail* with Madison Opera, plus Ernesto in *Don Pasquale* and Tamino in *Die Zauberflöte* with Minnesota Opera, where he sang as a resident artist for two years. He has sung the tenor solo in Handel's *Messiah*, Orff's *Carmina Burana*, Mozart's *Requiem*, Bach's *Magnificat*, *Mattäus-Passion*, and *Cantata BWV 80* with Robert Spano and the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. Other orchestral appearances also include the Minnesota Orchestra, Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, Virginia Symphony, Rogue Valley Symphony, the Minnesota Bach Ensemble, Bach Roots Festival, and Cantus Vocal Ensemble. David was awarded regional finalist in the Metropolitan Opera competition, second place in both Opera Birmingham and the Marcello Giordani competitions, a William Matheus Sullivan grant, and recently placed third in the 2021 Rochester Oratorio Society Vocal Competition.

Baritone **Emery Stephens**, praised by the *Boston Phoenix* for his singing "with ringing suavity and articulate intelligence," enjoys discovering and performing diverse vocal music including underrepresented Black composers. A versatile and charismatic singer, Dr. Stephens has collaborated with Abridged Opera of Ontario, Wilmington Symphony, Carolina Ballet, Arbor Opera Theatre, Carnegie Hall/Weill Music Institute, Fenimore Art Museum, Spokane Symphony, Michigan Philharmonic, Ann Arbor Symphony, Boston Lyric Opera, Opera New England, Boston Early Music Festival, and the Michigan Opera Theatre's Education Program. Other performance highlights include a revival of Dave Brubeck's The Gates of Justice with renowned jazz pianist Jason Moran and his trio, The Bandwagon, sponsored by the Detroit Jazz Festival to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the passage of the Civil Rights Act. Additionally, he performed works by American composers, such as True Witness: A Civil Rights Cantata by Jodi Goble and a blues opera, De Organizer, by James P. Johnson, recorded for release in 2023 by Naxos. As a narrator, he has been heard in *The Passion of John Brown* by Jesse Ayers and *Paddle to the Sea* by Andre Meyers with Michigan Philharmonic, and the jazz-inspired *Sweet Music in Harlem* by Andy Kirschner, commissioned by the Ann Arbor Symphony, and Britten's The Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra with the St. Olaf Orchestra. He is the recipient of a Southeastern Minnesota Arts Council grant for a performance project, "Sharing the Legacy of Spirituals," which focuses on American music and historical narratives as an interdisciplinary lens for teaching. Dr. Stephens is an assistant professor of music at St. Olaf College and serves as the Minnesota District Governor for the National Association of Teachers of Singing.
