# A Director's Note

When Abs and Veronica shared an early draft of *Lighthouse* last year, I was halfway through when I knew we needed to do it at St. Olaf. Listening to Veronica's amazing demo tracks as I followed Bus on in her four-day odyssey into the heart of a blizzard, the story cut deep into its midwestern roots, and the characters' raw emotion resonated in ways both timely and profound. At the same time, the chance to produce the world premiere of a new musical, co-authored by Abs, a distinguished alumna of our Theater department, set in a rural Minnesota town in the winter, *in a rural Minnesota town in the winter*, was clearly a sign the stars were aligning. And so I excitedly sent Abs and Veronica a note, and our work began.

Of all stories, I have always been drawn to those about people who love deeply and desperately, but who for complicated reasons struggle to express this, or to receive love from others, even when unconditionally offered. Such stories seem utterly human, as they're about the myriad ways we defend and protect ourselves not solely against unknown enemies but those closest to us–our parents, partners, children and friends. This would be comic if it wasn't so tragic, or maybe it's the other way around. I'm biased, but for me live theater is amongst the best ways to display this irony. And Abs and Veronica do it brilliantly in *Lighthouse*.

In *Lighthouse*, Bus, our totally unreliable narrator, may be an 18-year-old girl living amidst corn fields, but the challenges she faces are broadly relatable and widely shared. Trying to maintain her balance while enduring the disruptions of seizures, and anxiety of facing the future without a road map, Bus lashes out, retreats, digs deep, and, finally, with the greatest courage anyone can muster, tells herself, and accepts, an ultimate truth—all we really have is each other, right here, right now, one day at a time, on and on and on. There is a powerful hope in this, a lighthouse on a godforsaken stormy night. From all of us involved with this special project, we sincerely hope you leave the theater feeling more of it.
