BIOGRAPHIES



Dr. Travis J. Cross (he/him) serves as professor of music and director of bands at UCLA, where he conducts the Wind Ensemble and leads the graduate wind conducting program. He chaired the music department from 2018–2023 and was associate dean for academic mentoring and opportunity during the initial years of the UCLA Herb Alpert School of Music. Cross has conducted the UCLA Wind Ensemble at the California All-State Music Education Conference and College Band Directors National Association Western/Northwestern Division conference and prepared the band for centenary performances of Leonard Bernstein's Mass with Gustavo Dudamel and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. During five years as wind ensemble conductor at Virginia Tech, Cross led students in performances at the Virginia Music Educators Association conference, Kennedy Center, and Carnegie Hall and developed the Virginia Tech Band Directors Institute into a major conducting workshop. Cross earned doctor and master of music degrees in conducting from Northwestern University and the bachelor of music degree cum laude in vocal and instrumental music education from St. Olaf College. His principal teachers were Mallory Thompson and Timothy Mahr. Prior to graduate study, he taught for four years at Edina (Minn.) High School, where he conducted two concert bands and led the marching band program. Cross wrote a chapter for volume four of

Composers on Composing for Band and contributed to *The Horizon Leans Forward: Stories of Courage, Strength, and Triumph of Underrepresented Communities in the Wind Band Field* and *The Future of the Wind Band: Philosopher and Practitioner in Dialog*, all available from GIA Publications. His more than 20 original compositions and arrangements are published by Boosey & Hawkes, Daehn Publications/C.L. Barnhouse, and Theodore Music. Cross has appeared as a guest conductor, composer, and clinician in nearly 40 states; internationally in Australia, Canada, China, Germany, Japan, Korea, Singapore, Spain, Thailand, and the United Arab Emirates; as featured band clinician at the Texas Music Educators Association Clinic/Convention; and on several occasions at the Music for All National Festival and Midwest Clinic. He has engagements in California, Connecticut, Idaho, Indiana, Kentucky, Minnesota, Missouri, Utah, China, and Singapore during the 2024–25 season. Cross is a member of the Council of Korean Americans and a Yamaha Master Educator.

Each of Dr. Henry L. Dorn's compositions builds distinct narratives based on lived experiences of being a musician and African American, taking ideas and putting them in places where they do not seem to belong. Dorn (b. Little Rock, AR) has enjoyed performances by noteworthy ensembles across the country, including the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, American Composers Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, the Grammy-winning Harlem Quartet, Aizuri Quartet, Argento Ensemble, and the Dallas Wind Symphony. Dorn is Assistant Professor of Music and Conductor of the St. Olaf Band at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. He is the former assistant director to the Memphis Area Youth Wind Ensemble, and former director to the Memphis-based Nu Chamber Collective. Dorn has also worked with musicians of the United States Army Field Band, the United States Air Force Band, and has guest conducted the United States Army Band "Pershing's Own." He's proud to have received multiple awards for his unique style, including an Inaugural Future of Music Faculty Fellowship from the Cleveland Institute of Music and an ASCAP Foundation's Morton Gould Young Composer Award. Dorn holds two Doctor of Musical Arts degrees - one in wind conducting and another in composition - from Michigan State University and has completed studies at The University of Memphis and at Peabody Institute of The Johns Hopkins University. He has studied conducting with Kevin L. Sedatole, Harlan D. Parker, and Kraig Alan Williams, and composition with David Biedenbender, Ricardo Lorenz, Alexis Bacon, Oscar Bettison, Kamran Ince, and Jack Cooper.





Dr. Michael Buck currently serves as director of the Norseman Band at St. Olaf College and is the Minnesota Music Education Specialist for Professional Development and Resources at the Perpich Center for Arts Education. Previously, Dr. Buck held higher education posts at The College of St. Scholastica and Augsburg University. Prior to entering higher education, Dr. Buck served over 20 years as a K–12 instrumental music educator in Minnesota and in two overseas American international schools in the Middle East and South Asia. His specialized areas of interest include assessment/evaluation, teaching/learning pedagogy, and music technology. Dr. Buck has presented peer-reviewed research projects and workshops in local, regional, national, and international settings. His work includes appearances at the International Symposium of Assessment in Music Education (ISAME), the International Society for Music Education/European Association for Music in Schools (ISME/EAS), Near East South Asia Council of Overseas Schools (NESA), the South Asia International Schools Association (SAISA), the College Music Society/Association for Technology in Music Instruction (CMS/ATMI), the Minnesota Music Educators Association (MMEA), the

Minnesota Band Directors Association (MBDA), and numerous school districts throughout Minnesota. Dr. Buck holds degrees from The University of Southern Mississippi, VanderCook College of Music, and St. Olaf College in music education and conducting.

Dr. Aileen Razey, Clarinetist and educator, Aileen Razey, aims to bridge diverse musical genres and artistic expressions. Her artistry is deeply intertwined with her commitment to education, aiming to help audiences and students better connect with themselves and the world around them through music. With double bass, piano, and dancers, she forms the International Collective, dedicated to performing music by living composers and merging responsibilities of music and dance in each performance. She often performs with the Paragon Ragtime Orchestra and previously performed with the Aspen Music Festival and School, Lucerne Festival Academy, Klangspuren Schwaz International Ensemble Modern Academy, Syracuse Orchestra, Allentown Symphony, Cayuga Chamber Orchestra, and Szavaria Symphony Orchestra. She can be heard as principal and e-flat clarinetist on five GIA records with the North Texas Wind Symphony. She was first prize winner of the inaugural Henri Selmer Summer Clarinet



Academy Solo Competition and semi-finalist in the Lisbon International Clarinet Competition. Dr. Razey is currently Assistant Professor at St. Olaf College in Minnesota and previously taught at Ithaca College and Kutztown University. She is a D'Addario Woodwind Clinician and plays on D'Addario Reserve reeds, is an Henri Selmer Paris Artist, serves as Chapter President for the College Music Society Northeast, and previously served on the ICA's Health and Wellness Committee. Razey earned degrees from the University of North Texas where she studied with Kim Cole Luevano, University of Denver where she studied with Jeremy Reynolds, and Ithaca College where she studied with Michael Galvan.



Tubist Jason Tanksley is a performer and educator based in Fridley, Minnesota, and is currently the instructor of tuba at St. Olaf College. In addition to his work in higher education, Tanksley leads an active career as a performer. He has performed with orchestras including the Cleveland Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Minnesota Orchestra, Oregon Symphony, Atlanta Symphony, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and the Jacksonville Symphony. As a soloist, Tanksley has appeared with the International Symphony Orchestra, Birmingham Concert Band, Wayne State University Symphony Orchestra, as well as its Wind Symphony. A native of Eastpointe, Michigan, Tanksley graduated from Detroit's Wayne State University, where he studied with Dennis Nulty. Tanksley also holds a master of music degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music, where he studied under the instruction of Yasuhito Sugiyama. Tanksley is proudly a B&S and Melton Meinl Weston performing artist and clinician.
