

Maundy THURSDAY

As part of Holy Week, Maundy Thursday recalls the gathering of Jesus with his disciples for the traditional Passover meal on the night before he was crucified.

The word “Maundy” comes from the Latin “mandatum” which means “commandment.” The overarching theme of Maundy Thursday is Jesus’ new commandment to “love one another as I have loved you.” Jesus’ love is demonstrated both in his example of servanthood by washing the feet of his disciples and in his gift of himself in the Holy Communion.


