# Scene Shop Supervisor School of Performing Arts South Dakota State University

The South Dakota State University School of Performing Arts seeks candidates with outstanding organizational and leadership skills to manage and supervise the Theatre Scene Shop. This is a 12 month, full-time, benefit eligible position. This position reports to the Director of the School of Performing Arts.

SDSU is especially interested in candidates that address the experiences of underrepresented minorities in organizations. Women, minorities, veterans, and people with disabilities are especially encouraged to apply.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

The Scene Shop Supervisor will provide a comprehensive experiential learning environment for theatre students in all aspects of scenic construction, shop safety, loadins, and strikes. This position will be responsible for day-to-day operations of the scene shop, including maintenance, ordering of materials and supplies, inventory and personnel management, and maintaining an overall safe and positive work environment. This position will work with the Theatre Faculty and the Performing Arts Center Operations Manager to ensure safe and appropriate usage of theatrical performance spaces.

The successful candidate will possess a general knowledge of industry standard practices and materials in scenic construction and scenic engineering techniques, as well the ability to guide and mentor all levels of students. The Scene Shop Supervisor will be an integral part of the theatre staff and may be involved in decision making about season selection and other matters. This position will be expected to remain competent in current practices by maintaining professional licensures and contacts.

### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's degree in Theatre with an emphasis in Technical Theatre by start date.
- At least one year practical work experience in the technical preparation and construction of scenery and stage units.
- Previous professional supervisory experience.
- Experience organizing, managing, and prioritizing workload.
- Mechanical skills in the use of hand and power tools, and gas and electric welders.
- The ability to read and understand floor plans and use standard theatrical drafting software.
- Strong oral and written communications skills.
- The ability to collaborate on securing materials for scenery construction and work with an established budget.
- The ability to lift and carry materials weighing between 50 100 pounds on a daily basis.
- The ability to work evenings and/or weekends, particularly prior to openings of theatre production presentations.

# PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Advanced degree in Theatre.
- At least three years (may include work with summer theatre companies) practical work experience in the technical preparation and construction of theatre scenery and stage units.
- Previous supervisory experience in a higher education setting and/or previous professional experience mentoring students.
- Experience working within OSHA health and safety standards.
- Experience with other theatrical technology areas such as Electrics, Audio/Video, Costumes, Props, Hair/Makeup, and/or Box Office operations.
